Outdoor Adventure. Of all the Caribbean islands, St. Kitts' warm turquoise waters are the most ideal for sailing, snorkeling, and diving. Visitors delight in a wide array of water sports offered from fly-boarding and kite surfing to jet ski snorkel adventures and powered paragliding. Hike the Valley of the Giants or zipline 250-feet above the St. Kitts spectacular rainforests.

Diving. Scuba divers of all ages and abilities delight in St. Kitts' glorious underwater world, with many sites virtually unexplored. Bordered by the Caribbean and the Atlantic, the island offers a range of options, from near-shore reefs to subaquatic caves. Underwater visibility ranges from 30- to 100-feet deep, meaning you'll have crystal-clear views of walls, ledges, under hangs, coral towers, and sunken ships, all swarming with sea life.

Kenny Bontz, Amputee Golfer

Some might say that Kenny was dealt a bad hand in life, but he would argue that the hand he was dealt is what helped make him the unique individual he is today. At the age of 11, Kenny started his uphill battle when he was diagnosed with Type I Diabetes. Years later, when he was 19, he was diagnosed with Ewing's Sarcoma in his lower leg, which is a rare type of cancerous tumor that grows in the bone. After numerous complications, Kenny made the brave decision to amputate that leg at the age of 35. With time and perseverance, he learned how to walk again using his new prosthetic leg and has gained a new appreciation for life. Kenny has owned two businesses (offset printing and landscaping) and is moving on to his next goal in life. One of his biggest passions is golf, and he has had the opportunity to travel the world to play in tournaments in four different countries and is a three-time National Amputee golf champion. Kenny is now looking forward to completing his next goal, which is to become the first amputee to play on the PGA Champions Tour.

The DIRT Behind Damage Prevention: Using Data to Reduce Damages

Sarah K. Magruder Lyle, president and chief executive officer of the Common Ground Alliance (CGA), will give an overview of the important role that Damage Information Reporting Tool (DIRT) data plays in implementing effective damage prevention processes and programs across stakeholder groups. Magruder Lyle will discuss the most recent DIRT report, which analyzes all 2017 data submitted anonymously and voluntarily by facility operators, utility locating companies, one call centers, professional contractors, regulators and others. Streamlined automated data upload tools ensure that data submission is

quick and seamless, meaning data submission can take as little as an hour once a year!

She will also highlight the important role data plays in developing targeted educational programs and fostering engagement focused on reducing damages to the underground infrastructure and minimizing costly downtime. An overview of CGA's Best Practices, which are designed to improve worker safety, protect vital underground infrastructure and ensure public safety during excavation will also be provided. These programs – developed with CGA's core philosophy of shared responsibility of all stakeholders in mind – provide our members with critical tools to help educate their peers and communities about the importance of calling 811 before digging and the safe digging process.

CGA, the preeminent source of damage prevention data and information, is a member-driven association of nearly 1,700 individuals, organizations and sponsors in every facet of the underground utility industry. CGA is committed to saving lives and preventing damage to North American underground infrastructure by promoting effective damage prevention practices.

PCCA Golf Tournament

St. Kitts Sampling of Heritage and Culture

1:30 - 4:30 pm

Step back in time for a sampling of the heritage and culture of St. Kitts, all neatly bundled into this lush picturesque landscape. Passing through the town of Basseterre, the waters of the Caribbean unfold as the tour winds its way along the West Coast to beautiful Romney Manor. Once the home of descendants of Thomas Jefferson, Romney Manor is now the home of Caribelle Batik, creator of some of the finest batik products in the world. You will watch as artists expertly demonstrate batik techniques and provide a full narration of the ancient art form and its history. Then you can browse the bright and colorful shop where no two pieces are exactly alike.



From there, it's on to the historic Brimstone Hill Fortress, where guests can discover the rich history that gave St. Kitts its name as the Mother Colony of the Caribbean. Situated almost 800 feet above sea level, this remarkable fortress is one of the most dramatic spots in the entire Caribbean, both historically

and aesthetically. It commands astounding views of the Caribbean, including Nevis, Montserrat, St Eustatius, Saba, St. Martin, and St. Barths.

After Brimstone, there will be a brief stop in Basseterre for shopping before continuing to the hotel.

Half-Day Rainforest Hike

1 - 4:30 pm

Discover the enchanting world of the mountain rainforest on this moderate hiking adventure that includes visits to a beautiful tropical garden and an abandoned colonial sugar mill. With a short drive along the Caribbean coast, you enter the protected rainforest sanctuary at Wingfield Estate.



You follow a giant loop trail for one to two hours, using walking sticks and taking frequent stops for interpretation and viewing of wildlife. The group follows the banks of the Wingfield River and then goes back to base camp, the site of an old sugar mill at the edge of the rainforest. In the cool shade of this pre-Columbian Rainforest Sanctuary, you can catch a glimpse of Vervet monkeys, hummingbirds, and much more—a photographers dream!

At tours' end, celebrate with light refreshments at the old colonial sugar mill, followed by a brief description of the production of crystallized sugar in St. Kitts during the colonial times.

Transportation

Taxi: Unmetered taxi service is available from the hotel lobby at fixed rates. You can ask one of the bellmen to assist.

Airport: St. Kitts is easily reached from the United States as the Robert L. Bradshaw International Airport (SKB) handles dozens of non-stop, connecting, and charter flights daily. The hotel is 4 miles from the airport, and a taxi costs about \$16 (U.S.) one-way.

Travel Details

PASSPORT REQUIRED. All people with the exception of citizens of the OECS (Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States) traveling to St. Kitts are required to present a valid passport in order to enter St. Kitts-Nevis.

The Eastern Caribbean Dollar (XCD) is the local currency. U.S. bills are accepted by most stores and businesses, and change is given in E.C. currency. U.S. coins are not accepted. The current exchange rate is U.S.\$1.00 = E.C.\$2.70.

English is the primary language on St. Kitts.

Weather

The climate in St. Kitts and Nevis is tropical, hot and humid all year round, with a relatively cool and dry season from January to mid-April. The average high on April 1 is 83, and the average low is 76.

What to Wear

PCCA meetings are largely resort casual, meaning that shorts, golf shirts, sandals, and sneakers are acceptable, but you wouldn't look out of place in slacks and a dress shirt. For the Annual Prayer Breakfast, people get a little dressier; some men wear sport coats.

Pre- and Post-Convention Rates

The resort will honor the discounted PCCA room rate for three days before and three days after the convention, based on availability.
